THE PLAN FOR THE 2023 LEAGUE FORMAT WILL BE PLAYED OVER EIGHT MONTHS OF THE CALENDAR YEAR TO GIVE CONTINUED DEVELOPMENT AND AN INCREASED POTENTIAL TO RAISE OVERALL STANDARDS OF THE FEMALE GAME IN BARBADOS.

THE BFA STRIVES TO INSPIRE POSITIVE CHANGE FROM GRASSROOTS FOOTBALL, TO NATIONAL LEVELS, WITH AN EMPHASIS ON INCREASING PARTICIPATION AT PRIMARY, SECONDARY AND COMMUNITY LEVELS. WE HAVE SET OUT TO GROW PARTICIPATION ON AND OFF THE FIELD BY PUTTING FOOTBALL EDUCATION, LIFE SKILLS SUPPORT, AND EMPLOYABILITY EDUCATION AT THE FOREFRONT OF THE DIFFERENT BFA PROGRAMMES.

WITH THE SUPPORT FROM FIFA AND CONCACAF, WE HAVE A GREAT OPPORTUNITY TO RAISE THE PROFILE OF BARBADIAN FOOTBALL. WITH A KEY FOCUS ON EMPOWERING FEMALE PLAYERS AND ALLOWING THOSE INVOLVED TO HAVE INPUT IN RESHAPING THE FUTURE OF FEMALE FOOTBALL IN BARBADOS, WE MUST FOCUS OUR ATTENTION AND RESOURCES ON RAISING AWARENESS FOR THE FEMALE GAME AND INCREASING PARTICIPATION IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS.

FOOTBALL HAS THE POWER TO MAKE A POSITIVE IMPACT ON PLAYERS' LIVES. AS A FEDERATION, THE BFA IS DETERMINED TO BUILD AND EMPOWER FEMALE PLAYERS BY GIVING THEM THE PLATFORM TO GROW.

WOMEN'S FOOTBALL HAS GROWN IMMENSELY IN RECENT YEARS. GIRLS AND WOMEN ALL OVER THE WORLD ARE NOW PASSIONATELY INVOLVED IN THE GAME, BOTH ON AND OFF THE FIELD, WHILE USING FOOTBALL TO BREAK DOWN VARIOUS SOCIAL BARRIERS.

I HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN FOOTBALL FROM 2007, WHERE MY JOURNEY BEGAN AS A PLAYER AND MY LOVE FOR THE GAME GREW SIGNIFICANTLY. FOOTBALL HAS SINCE THEN BEEN THE VEHICLE THAT TRANSPORTED ME FROM CHAOS TO OPPORTUNITY AND HAS GRANTED ME THE GREAT ADVANTAGE OF EXCELLING AS AN ADMINISTRATOR, WHILE CREATING A PATHWAY FOR YOUNG GIRLS TO BE BRAVE IN A MALEDOMINATED ENVIRONMENT.

IT IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT THAT WE CONTINUE TO IMPROVE WOMEN'S FOOTBALL IN BARBADOS, AS TRACK PROGRESS BASED ON STRATEGIC GOALS AND MAINTAIN THE STANDARD OF BRIDGING THE GENDER INEQUALITY GAP IN SPORT.

THE IMPLEMENTATION OF GIRL'S GRASSROOTS FOOTBALL IS ALSO HIGHLY ANTICIPATED AS WE ARE EAGERLY AMBITIOUS TO EXPAND GIRLS' PARTICIPATION AND AWARENESS AT THE FUNDAMENTAL STAGE.

- We want technical gifted players who understand the game tactically.
- Concentrating on 1v1 attacking and defending.
- Dribbling effectively with maximum ball control that challenge them in decision making situation.



PLAYING PHILOSOPHY

Key Coaching Points...

- Encouraging goalkeepers to be confident to play out from the back and play under pressure.
- Midfield players to be able to manipulate the ball under pressure to be able to retain and play forward.
- Attackers to be able to run in behind to stretch the game, or receive to feet and attack with pace with a shot or cross.

- To dominate with progressive possession football in all areas of the pitch, pass with a purpose and penetrate lines.
- Develop players who can be creative and clever both individually in 1v1 situations, and when combining with others.
- Create a playing style that encourage a mixture of game styles based upon when to play to feet and when to play into space whilst creating and exploring overloads.

• Defend early to regain possession.

- Play between the lines with quick precise forward passing.
- Be organized and disciplined in the team shape out of possession.
- Counterattack with speed.

FORMATION 4-2-3-1

We want to have an aggressive counter attacking playing style based on a primary 4-2-3-1 formation with two defensive midfielders protecting the defence.

Even though we want to play an exciting brand of attacking football that entertains the supporters, we first and foremost need to have a reputation of a team that is hard to beat and is well organised defensively

When building from the back we want to dominate the ball in a controlled but progressive passing style. Which looks to either play between the lines for our number 10, advance the attacking midfielder or a switch of play to be able to isolate possession. A controlled but progressive style of play.

FOOTBALL FOR SCHOOLS

A programme where football meets education, inspiring children to learn life skills through fun football sessions.

DEVELOPING THE PLAYER

A FOCUS ON PLAYER DEVELOPMENT, RATHER THAN RESULTS AND OUTCOMES AT U9 & U13 LEVEL. THE AIM IS TO IMPROVE TECHNICAL SKILLS AND TACTICAL AREAS OF THE GAME. THE BFA WILL GIVE THE INTERNATIONAL COACHES PLAYER DEVELOPMENT TARGETS TO MAKE SURE PLAYERS REACH A CERTAIN LEVEL. THIS WILL ENSURE THAT WHEN THEY REACH INTERNATIONAL SENIOR LEVELS, EACH PLAYER WILL BE WELL EQUIPPED WITH THE TOOLS TO ELEVATE AND IMPROVE THE NATIONAL TEAM STANDARDS. WE ASPIRE TO ESTABLISH A "BARBADIAN FOOTBALLER DNA" FOR PEOPLE TO RECOGNISE. KEY QUALITIES OF SUCH A PLAYER WOULD BE WELL DISCIPLINED, CREATIVE, ADAPTABLE, HARD-WORKING AND FORWARD THINKING.

UTILISE OUR RESOURCES


Utilize our coach educators on the island to help and support local club coaches. Use national players with coaching and refereeing licences as role models to help generate and promote interest in such qualifications.

Football Education

CAREER HUB

Moving forward, football education will be a key focus for the BFA in an attempt to develop a cohort of well-rounded players, both on and off the pitch. The federation will prioritize developing players' tactical understanding of the game whilst also providing transferable life skills and career education to its players.

We look to engage and help players outside of football by introducing a career hub as an added level of support. Here players will have access to a variety of different courses and employability programmes including public speaking sessions, scholarship preparation, wellbeing sessions and work experience opportunities.

We recognize the importance of the power of sport and need to look at ways to best support the women moving through our system, football education and access to a career hub will provide this.

WHAT WILL BE INVOLVED...

LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME:

Creating well rounded captains on and off the pitch.

MENTORSHIP PROGRAMME:

Senior players supporting and helping the young players, creating positive role models.

SAFEGUARDING WORKSHOPS:

For both coaches, staff and players - understanding and developing a safe environment for everyone involved.

SCHOLARSHIP PATHWAYS:

We will champion players who excel abroad, players will learn valuable life skills and understand new challenged. Lets allow them to guide and positively impact the next generation.

SETTING STANDARDS:

Every player between 16 - 20 that has played more than five national games will be offered and encouraged to engage in our BFA Coaching Licensing Course.

WORK EXPERIENCE:

As part of the career pathway. We will show players that it is important to understand that there is more to football with a work experience opportunity and career advice.

CAREER HUB

- To have players who are in the international set up between the ages of 16 – 20 to gain their BFA Coaching License.
- Give players the opportunity to gain a new qualification.
- Raise awareness of varied career opportunities.
- Introduce a player mentorship programme.
- Ensure coaching opportunities for players that lead into the national set up.
- Increase participation by showcasing the opportunities we provide in terms of career pathways as well as football development.
- Tactical development and understanding.
- Provide 'Rules of the Game' workshop.
- Create well rounded leaders on and off the pitch.
- Create role models for the future generations.
- Barbados DNA Player and the person.



CREATING A FRIENDLY AND SAFE ENVIROMENT



SPECTATORS PROTOCAL

Definition of a spectator: A spectator will be considered to be any person who is not listed and suitably attired to actively participate in the currently scheduled match in an official capacity (either as a player, a member of team staff or a match official) or a representative of one of the organizing bodies of the competition who is there to represent their organization in a formal/official function.

Regardless of the relationship that a spectator may have with a player or member of staff, he/she must abide by the general rules for all spectators as outlined below. Failure to abide by these rules may result in temporary or permanent debarment from entering the facility, at the sole discretion of the Barbados Football Association (BFA).

Spectators should enter the compound via the officially designated spectator entrances for the event, as indicated by the BFA. Upon entry, they may be subject to security checks.

No weapons or illegal drugs are allowed on the compound.

Spectators are not allowed to bring pets/animals onto the compound.

Spectators are allowed to observe ONLY from the designated spectator areas for the event, as indicated by the BFA.

There is to be no running or horseplay by spectators in the stands or anywhere else on the compound. Spectators are asked not to bring footballs onto the compound.

Spectators may seek shelter or shade under the tents between the stands but are not allowed to go under the stands for any reason.

Spectators may purchase items from any of the food and drink vendors behind the stands if/when they are open for business but must not under any circumstances or at any time enter the stalls and/or take items from the stalls that they have not purchased. Any such unauthorized action constitutes a criminal act and the police will be notified accordingly.

In the event that a ball leaves the field, spectators may return the ball to the field safely but are not obligated to do so. Note, however, that any ball that leaves the field remains the property of the BFA. If a ball goes under the stands, spectators are asked to leave the ball - a member of BFA staff will collect it.

The designated washroom facilities for spectators are located behind the southernmost stand.

Only players and team staff are allowed to enter the field, regardless of what may or may not be happening on the field. The only exception may be in the case of a medical emergency, when a parent, under advice/request from BFA officials, may be asked to enter the field.

Parents/Guardians are required to supervise the conduct of their children who are present as spectators. Failure to do so may result in both the parent/guardian and the child being removed from the compound.

Any behaviour that is deemed to be distracting or disruptive to the match or to bring the image of the BFA into disrepute will be grounds for removal of the persons involved from the compound.

No one, other than the players and team staff who are actively designated to the matchday list, should enter the dressing rooms or congregate on the steps outside the dressing rooms.

The provisions outlined above may be amended or added to at the discretion of the BFA whenever the need arises.

Congratulations on your selection to be a Trident!

In addition to the honour and privilege of potentially wearing the blue and gold in international competition there are some responsibilities that come along with being an ambassador of your country. Remember that at all times and in all places, you represent yourself, family, community, the BFA, the Bajan football fraternity and the island itself.

1) BE PROFESSIONAL

Be suited up, on the field and ready to commence training activities at least 15 minutes prior to the scheduled start time. If you cannot attend a session punctually then you should make every effort to communicate with the team manager beforehand to expect your tardiness or absence.

Dress in the appropriate, official national team apparel for all national team activities. Clothes should fit appropriately and be worn as they were designed to be worn. Don't wear national team apparel when you are not engaged in official national team activities/duty.

Conduct yourself as though the camera is on, the world is watching and all the people you represent are depending on you to portray the best of them. Even when you are not involved in official national team activities/duty you are expected to behave in a manner that upholds the image of a national player.



2) BE RESPECTFUL

This means using respectful language and behaviour towards ALL people. We must all stand against all forms of harassment and abuse (physical, psychological, emotional and sexual). Whilst banter is expected amongst teammates, the use of derogatory or discriminatory terms based on race, religion, social status, cultural background and sexuality towards anyone is unacceptable. Similarly, we must not seek to intentionally cause physical harm to teammates, opponents or anyone else.

Respect for the authority of persons based on their position/role should be adhered to, on and off of the field, and even away from the training/playing environment.

As a player, it is also your right to be shown the same respect as outlined above. If you experience or witness disrespect or discrimination you can and should report it to your Team Manager and/or the BFA's Safeguarding Officer. You do not need to tolerate it.

3) BE INDUSTRIOUS

Work hard. Push your limits. Give your best effort. No excuses.

4) BE DISCIPLINED

We know that the job is demanding and that the assignments may sometimes seem daunting. Your unwavering dedication to maintaining the high standards we set is what will elevate Barbados to footballing greatness. We may not always be at the end of the success but we all play a part in the journey.

5) BE ENCOURAGING

We support each other through positive, uplifting communication. The best that Team Barbados has to offer will only be realized through encouraging each other to push our limits and persevere over the challenges we encounter. We will set the example for all of society of how to collaborate to make each person and the team the best versions of ourselves we can be.
